## **Benefits of being a TA**

 Quarterly Partial Fee Remission + Health Insurance + Salary in 2024-2025 (>25% time/10hrs a week):

> Academic Tuition: \$5,041 Health Insurance: \$2,891 Salary (50% time): \$11,333 (Increment 1) TOTAL for 1 Q: \$19,265

- These numbers will be updated for Fall.
- TA positions do NOT pay NRST or professional fees
- Transferable skills
  - Presenting, networking, best way to learn is to teach



## **TA Eligibility**

You must be:

- Currently registered and enrolled in at least 8 units
  - If registered in over 20 units you will be contacted
- In good academic standing
  - >3.0 GPA
  - Fewer than 12 units of unfinished coursework
  - Not on academic probation
  - Be within normative time and/or time to degree standards
  - Certified as having language proficiency in spoken English if their native language is not English.
    - Non-native English speakers MUST take TA exam
- Exceptions: Total campus employment 51-75% Bren approval needed, 75-100% Graduate Division approval required



#### How to get a Bren TA position

- Check the Bren <u>Funding & Employment website</u>
  - PhD students talk with Faculty Advisor about funding plan during annual review
  - We typically hire about 40 1Q positions for the year
    - Positions are 25-50% time (10-20 hours per week)
    - Class must have >35 students for a TA to be assigned
    - Not all TAships include discussion/lab sections
  - Only PhDs can TA for Bren courses
  - You must submit a TA application (opened in early March- due April 14)
  - Bren TA Application Process
  - If no Bren students are qualified, we look to other depts.

## Where to get a non-Bren TA position

2024-2025: Bren students filled over 200 TA appointments at 25-50% time in non-Bren departments. We anticipate the number will be smaller in 2025-2026 due to reduced funding availability.

- Outside Departments
  - Watch your email for announcements
  - Look for information on department websites
    - UCSB Departments: <u>Academic Departments & Programs | UC Santa Barbara</u>
  - Each department has its own process, reach out to their graduate advisor staff for details.
    - List of departments and contact info (ASE Open Positions): <u>Graduate Student</u> <u>Academic Appointments</u>
    - <u>Environmental Studies</u> has their own application, posted on their "Open Positions" webpage: <u>https://es.ucsb.edu/index.php/jobs</u>
      - Applications open April 15, tentatively close May 26; typically makes offers by July 1st.
    - Economics sends a call and begins accepting applications Aug 1
    - <u>Earth Science</u>: email <u>quinlan@ucsb.edu</u> to be placed on mailing list to receive quarterly information about TAships
  - Reader appointments: Hourly, usually less than 20%, grading assignments
  - Be respectful of staff time. Avoid repeated emails to ask about openings.

- Subscribe to the <u>UCSB Graduate Division's GradTeach Forum located on</u> <u>Google Groups</u>
- Reminder:
  - Academic Student Employment, like all employment, is not guaranteed and students have to pursue it like any other employment.
  - Hiring Departments must submit an Eligibility Verification form for approval by Bren for all TA/Reader/GSR positions BEFORE they can officially hire you. Have departments submit Eligibility Verification forms to eligibility@bren.ucsb.edu.





#### <u>Mandatory:</u>

- TA Orientation before school starts in September: <u>New TAs</u>
   <u>Office of Teaching & Learning</u> (Advisable to do early)
- Sexual Harassment Prevention Training via Campus Clarity <u>Helpful:</u>
- Laboratory Safety Training (required for all UCSB laboratory workers) - <u>Fundamentals of Laboratory Safety</u>

   Live training you can do if hired
- Teaching Assistant Certificate Programs: <u>TA Certificate</u>
   <u>Programs | Office of Teaching & Learning</u>
- TA Workshops: <u>TA Training and Workshops | Office of</u> <u>Teaching & Learning</u>



#### **TAships and Non-native English speakers**

- TA Language Evaluation
  - If home language is other than English and offered TA position for the first time. Call goes out in July for early September test dates.
  - Short presentation on academic topic, presented to two UCSB faculty (one from EMS and one from dept. you will TA)
  - Potential Outcomes
    - Certified to Teach
    - Conditionally Certified
      - EMS Oral skills course required
    - Not Certified
      - Complete EMS oral skills course and must be re-assessed

- Advisable to do early; good to have it completed ahead of time

- If submitting applications:
  - Graduate Advisor: Assistant Dean of Academic Programs
  - Eligibility verifications: eligibility@bren.ucsb.edu
- Apply early most departments want to hire their TAs for the next academic year during the prior spring
- Branch out apply in departments beyond your major/environmental science
- Monitor your email we send last-minute postings
- Use your Networking skills!
- Be professional.



## **Accepting a Position**

- <u>READ YOUR CONTRACT</u>: Know what you are signing up for
  - 50% time position= 20 hours a week
  - Are there required trainings in advance of the start of the course?
  - Does it fit your schedule? Are you expected to go to lecture? Do you need to enroll in a TA Practicum course? It is NOT acceptable to miss Bren classes because you have a TA commitment.
  - Are there exams you need to proctor?
  - Hiring department will provide you space for office hours
  - Tell your hiring department if you have other campus employment
- Follow-through, act professional
  - Accepting an offer requires you signing a contract and commit to the job. Respect that this expectation goes both ways. If you have multiple offers, you need to choose one, sign a contract, and decline other positions.
  - Bailing on TAships is unacceptable and impacts ALL Bren students and our reputation.
